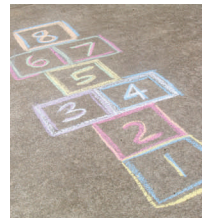

## Children's Services Update

### Rainy River Best Start Hub and Child Care Services

Renovations at the new site for consolidated Children's Services in Rainy River commenced in January 2009. Rainy River Playschool Inc. will be moving into their new location at 310 Government Road in 2009 and the facility will house the Best Start HUB/Resource Centre, Toy Lending and full Child Care Services (Learn, Laugh & Play Children's Centre). Estimated completion date of the project is currently May/09. ## Land Ambulance News

We have picked up some extra help for the next couple months at the Fort Frances base! Eight paramedic students from Confederation College are joining our paramedics as part of their college program. Each student will work with a paramedic crew for one twelve hour day and one twelve hour night shift as part of a familiarization into the ambulance field. Since the students have only completed one year of college, at this point they are only allowed to observe patient care. The time spent with our dedicated paramedics, provides the students with valuable experience and the opportunity to see hands-on patient care.

Starting in March, we will have another Confederation College Paramedic student working with our paramedic crews. This student has completed the two year Paramedic program and is required to mentor with a qualified paramedic for 288 hours. Once a student successfully completes the 288 hours, they receive their diploma and are eligible to write the Provincial Ministry of Health exam. If successful on the exam, 80% pass, they are eligible for employment as a paramedic in Ontario. This student may only provide basic patient care under the

direct supervision of one of our qualified paramedics. Advanced care continues to be provided by Rainy River District Emergency Medical Services paramedics. The learning experience is invaluable to the student, as it provides the opportunity for the student to participate in direct patient care, knowing that a fully qualified paramedic is ready and willing to assist.

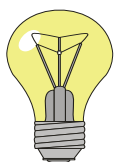

## Ontario Works Update



Effective January 1, 2009, the province assumes responsibility for 100% of the administrative costs for Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP).

Municipalities will no longer be billed for the following administrative costs:

1. Provincial cost of administration;
2. Direct delivery of ODSP;
3. Program and policy supports for ODSP and Ontario Works;
4. Technology costs, including the Service Delivery Model Technology (SDMT); and
5. ODSP Benefits Administration (e.g. dental benefits & doctor's fees).

The Ontario Works Employment Resource Centre will be running the following seminars for the months of February and March:

- Life Skills (running twice a week with the focus on employer-employee expectations in the work force)
- WHMIS
- Smart Serve
- Job Club
- Resume Development
- Interviewing Skills

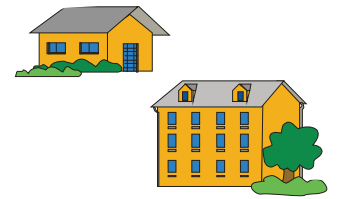

## Ministry of Municipal Affairs & Housing



The 2008 Provincial Budget announced \$100m in capital repair funding for social housing units. The RRDSSAB is pleased to announce that they have received one time funding in the amount of \$248,320.00 from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing. This commitment is intended to respond to urgent capital repair needs, including energy efficiency improvements. The primary project selection criteria is health and safety, and the provision of habitable, clean, and safe housing that meet municipal, provincial and federal standards, codes, regulations and legislation. These dollars have been distributed to all Non-Profit Housing Providers and DSSAB Housing Sites throughout the Rainy River District.
